The Round Top Area Historical Society plans to meet the Noak family concerns and objectives of maintaining and preserving the family home. After relocation to the Wood Annex and renovation, the house will function as a supplement to the historical center museum.

PAVILION NEWS

The Connersville Baptist Church African American Museum, the Krause Haus, the 1800's Log Cabin, and the Noak family home will all be joined together with the new pavilion at the Wood Annex. At this time the Round Top Area Historical Socety is currently receiving bids for phase I of the pavilion with hopes to soon complete the plans for the Wood Annex. The pavilion will become the focal point of the Wood Annex museum area and will be used for educational seminars and conferences.

NOAK HOUSE

Willie and Irene Noak raised a family of six children in the Noak home. They were hard working farmers, wise and loving parents, and faithful members of the old Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Round Top. Willie and Irene served their community, their country, and their church. Their greatest legacy was the values by which they lived and passed on to future generations.

RENOVATIONS, CONSTRUCTION, & MAINTENANCE

The Round Top Area Historical Society is served by volunteers and depends upon membership dues, grants, donations, memorials, Christmas Home Tour proceeds, and Annual Garage Sale proceeds for all renovations, construction and maintenance of its historical structures.
